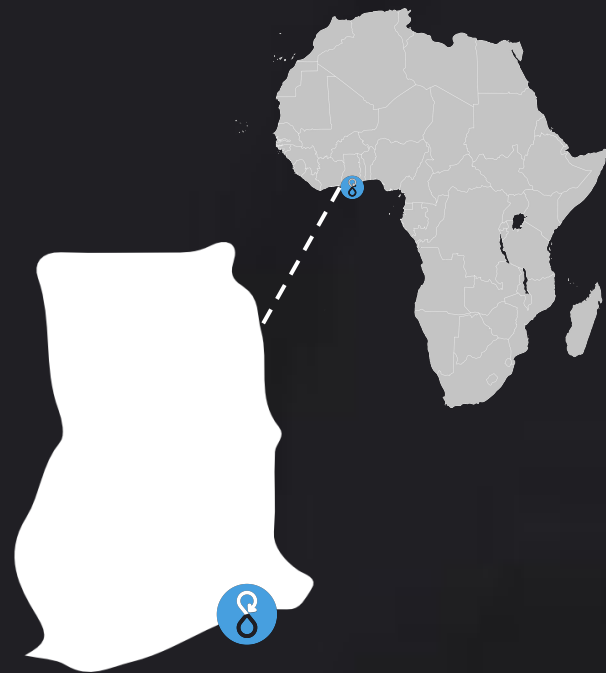
WHERE YOU'RE *MAKING A DIFFERENCE*

GHANA, ACCRA

According to The Economist, just less than half of plastic waste generated in Ghana is collected, and only about 5% is recycled. Ghana struggles to build lasting waste management infrastructure and the lack of access to drinking water on tap has created a great dependence on single-use plastic nationally.

YOUR IMPACT

Born from a profound love for the sea and the lives it nurtures, this Impact Project is our effort to stop ocean-bound plastic waste from leaking into Accra's coasts, and protecting the Gulf of Guinea and its surrounding areas. Through this project, PET bottles that would otherwise be bound for marine ecosystems along the coast of Ghana are collected and processed for recycling.



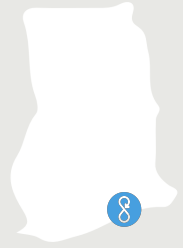

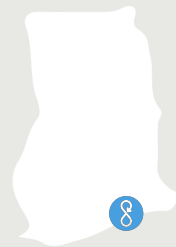

De-labelling of PET bottles, sorting by colour and cap removal and crushing of PET into flakes

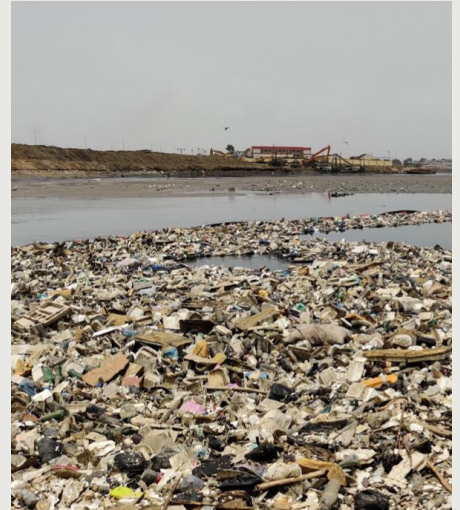
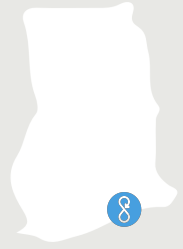

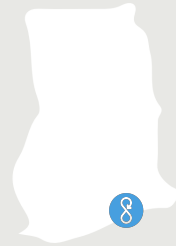
Crushed PET flakes are exported to factories for conversion into new products

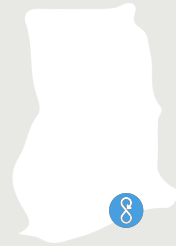

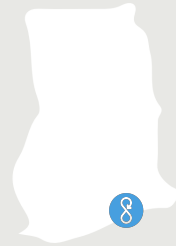
